Bdr Alley went out and unaided carried in a wounded man a distance of about 200 yards across No Man's Land under enemy machine gun, and artillery fire.</p> <p>Later when volunteers were called for to go out as stretcher bearers and bring in the wounded, this N.C.O was the first to volunteer and organised his gun detachment into bearer parties.
