Dvr Chandler was killed practically instantaneously on 8.8.18. His left arm and side being badly knocked about. He was buried in military cemetery in Vaire-sous-Corbie, France Sheet 62.D.J.31. d.8.4. The train he was driving in received a direct hit by 4.2. enemy shell, killing both men and horses. He was buried by Brigade Padre.



During the process of concentrating the remains of our fallen soldiers into established Military cemeteries abroad, the exhumation parties recently recovered the bodies of four former members of the 10th F.A. Brigade in the vicinity of Vaire-sous-Corbie, and from certain indications it was presumed that one of these was that of your son, the late No. 1835 Driver L.V. Chandler, 10th F.A. Brigade.

It is desired, however, to fully establish identification, if possible, before removing the body to its final resting place and officially registering the grave, and in order to assist the Graves Services in this direction it would be appreciated if you were to furnish this office, at the earliest opportunity, with any known particulars regarding the condition of the late soldier's teeth at the time of his enlistment.

You will be duly advised in the event of identification being conclusively proved.

39th Bty.F.A. A.I.F. advises that on visiting France
was informed that body which was buried at Vaire-sous-Corbie
had on exhumation for transference to Central Cemetery been
lost investigate and report urgently."

to which the following reply was despatched on the 21st idem:-

"With reference your cable 15th June - body of 1835
Leslie Victor Chandler, 39th Bty.has never been exhumed
from original burial place. Search still being made
will report result later."

The Imperial War Graves Commission were approached at once and
arrangements made for a search to be made in the vicinity where the above
named soldier, together with 3 other deceased members of the 39th Battery,
was reported to have been buried, namely, Vaire-Sous-Corbie Military
Cemetery, 62d.J.31.d.8.4. This was found to be identical with Vaire-sous-
Corbie Communal Cemetery.

The exhumation Party located a trench from which apparently other
bodies had been recovered previously. By resuming digging operations at
one end of the trench 4 bodies were discovered, but unfortunately no means
of identification were found on the remains. It was noted that 4 men of
the 39th Battery were shown on the Chaplain's report as buried together,
and as 4 bodies were recovered by the Exhumation Party it is reasonably
certain that these 4 bodies are identical with the four men mentioned on
that report, i.e.

1856 Dvr. W.G.MORRISSEY, 39th Bty.
35270 Gnr. J.G.BAYLIFF, "
1835 Dvr. L.V.CHANDLER, "
2340 Gnr. S.J.DUTTON, "

The Imperial War Graves Commission are satisfied that such is the
case and are prepared to erect a Collective Cross for the 4 men over the
graves in Vaire-sous-Corbie Communal Cemetery; the bodies will not be
removed from that burial ground.

It is thought, however, that if the personal descriptions of the
4 soldiers mentioned could be forwarded it would be quite possible to
identify each individual body without any difficulty. In that event a
separate cross will be erected for each soldier. What is particularly
desired is a description of the build of the 4 soldiers; and information
regarding the condition of their teeth at the time of enlistment would be
valuable. Also can it be ascertained whether Dvr. MORRISSEY, was granted
leave from France to U.K. during July 1916, 1917, or 1918?

If the above particulars could be obtained from Base Records,
Melbourne, it is considered that it will be possible to identify
definitely the remains of the four soldiers now buried in Vaire-sous-
Corbie Communal Cemetery.

With reference to the report of the regrettable loss of your son, the late No. 1835 Driver L.V.Chandler, 10th Field Artillery Brigade, I am now in receipt of advice which shows that he was killed practically instantaneously on 8.8.18, his left arm and side was badly knocked about. The train he was driving in received a direct hit by 4.2.enemy shell, killing both men and horses. He was buried in military cemetery in Vaire-sous-Corbie, France, by Brigade Padre.

The utmost care and attention is being devoted where possible to the graves of our soldiers. It is understood photographs of graves are being taken as soon as possible and these will be transmitted to next-of-kin when available.

These additional details are furnished by direction, it being the policy of the Department to forward all information received in connexion with deaths of members of the Australian Imperial Force.
