

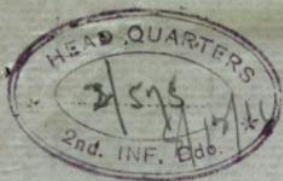

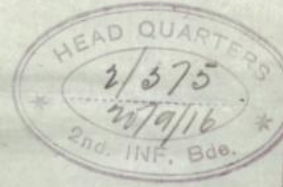

1. If discharged for disability caused Pension will he get?

(a) Every European soldier found to be totally disabled, owing to wounds or injuries, or sunstroke, received during military duty, or on account of blindness caused due directly and wholly to war service, gets a Pension Warrant of 21st May, 1915.

(b) If he is capable of partly supporting himself, and his earnings are less than 25s. a week, he may be granted a Pension with that sum will make up 25s. a week.

(c) He should clearly understand that the wages and allowances in fixing his pension are not what he actually receives. His earning capacity will be reviewed, and he should be to his advantage to refuse or throw up a job if it is increased or avoiding its reduction, or to neglect his health. *Appliance with which he may have been supplied.*

(g) If a partially disabled soldier is able to earn more than 25s. a week, he may benefit under the New Pension Warrant (even if he is not a Regular Soldier) may be pensioned under the 1914 Warrant if he carries no children's allowances.

(h) A soldier who has lost a leg, or an arm, or is otherwise disabled, may be granted a permanent pension of not less than 10s. 6d. a week, and a child's allowance.

2. If a Soldier, while on active service or has been injured so that he receives a Pension, what is done for him?

The State will provide him, free of cost, with all necessary appliances, such as artificial eyes, teeth, surgical appliances, etc. Applications should be addressed to the Secretary, Royal Hospital, Haslemere, Surrey.
