
I am forwarding herewith at the request of the Imperial War Graves Commission a printed order form referring to the publication of Part III of Villers-Bretonneux Memorial Register containing the particulars of the late No. 1861 Private E.H.R. HAYES, 40th. Battalion.

Prompt attention will be given to orders received in this connection, and the Registers will be forwarded post free to applicants on receipt of remittance.

It will be noted from the proof slip entry that the deceased's first Christian name has inadvertently been shown in error and should properly read "ELVIN", and the discrepancy is being brought to the notice of the Commission with a view to ensuring the accuracy of the memorial inscription. 

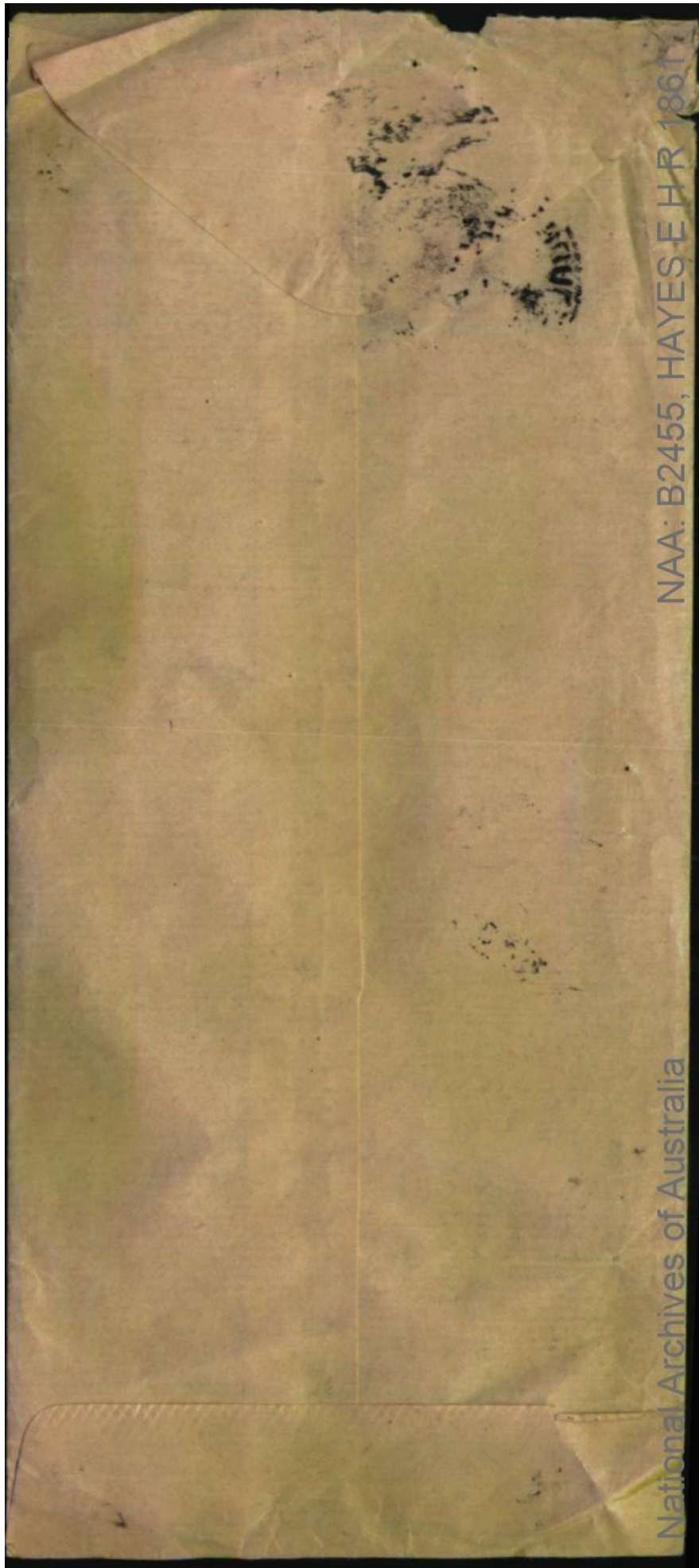

The names, ranks and other particulars of the Dead have been compiled from information furnished by the Naval and Military Record Offices and the next-of-kin. A proof slip of the entry in which you are interested is attached to the form opposite ; corrections shown in pencil on the left hand side of it will be included in the Register. The number shown on the right hand side is the reference to the entry and will not be included.

The letters and numerals at the end of the entry represent the final registration of the burial. In the majority of Registers the number of the Plot (if there is more than one Plot) is indicated by a Roman numeral, the Row by a capital letter and the Grave by a number.

The Registers are compiled for official use, but it has been found that many of the relatives and friends of the fallen wish to possess a copy (or copies) of the Register in which they have a special interest, and copies are sold to them at cost price. 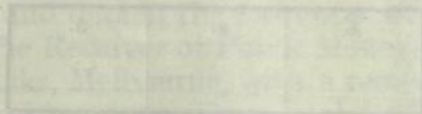



