K. Nov. 6th 1916. Det: D & B.

Lt. Kennedy was killed at Goose Alley - at the jumping off point at Flers about Nov. 4 5th. He hadn't got five yds from the trench when he was killed by a bullet in the head. He was in the first wave, and I saw him lying dead as I went over with the second wave. He was buried on the top of the trench just where he fell. The pioneers put up a cross over his grave and I have seen it.

He was in B Co. At Havre on the 5th Nov. I saw Lt. Kennedy lying dead in the trench, just outside our trench. He had been killed by machine gun. He had been over during the day and took two lines of German trenches which we lost at night. I do not know if his body was brought in.
