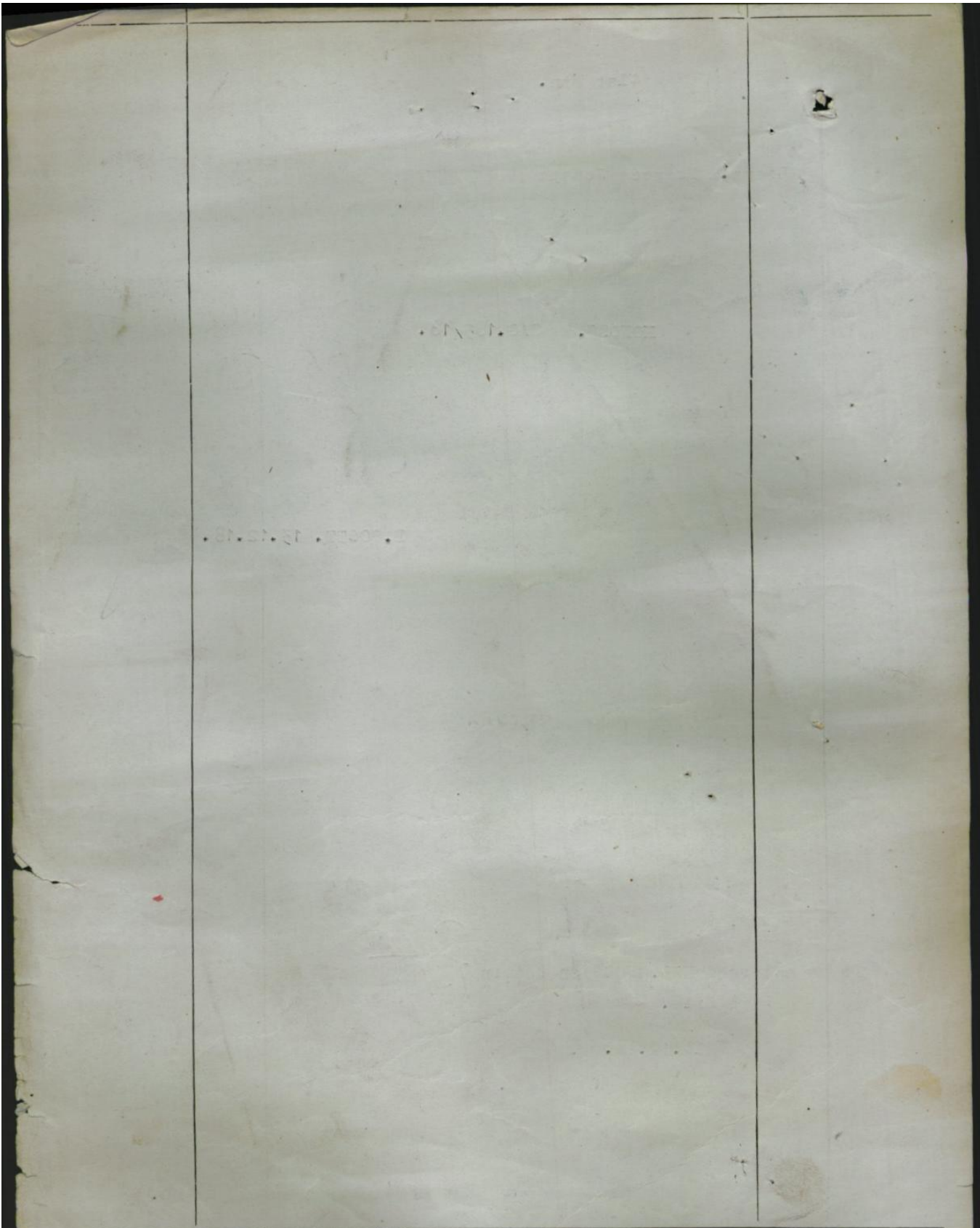

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. He located an enemy post of eight men which had been harassing our line for some days. He led a party and surrounded the post, killing two and capturing three, including the N.C.O. in charge. He then withdrew without any casualties. "

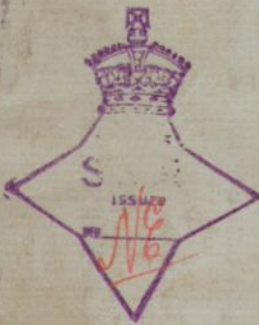
