With reference to your enquiry regarding the stars on the tunic included in package D/S 48897, personal effects of your son, the late Lieutenant A.J. Palliser, Australian Flying Corps, as this Officer was first reported missing, and it was not until some time later that he was adjudged, as the result of a Court of Inquiry, to have been killed in action, the tunic he was wearing at the time of his death would not have been recovered, and that article included in the abovementioned package was in all probability a spare tunic from which he himself removed the stars.

With regard to the prop stick, stated to be missing from the abovementioned package - personal effects are packed at A.I.F. Headquarters, London, and transmitted from this Office in exactly the same condition as received, without re-packing. It would therefore appear that the prop stick was omitted from the suit case in England, but as advice has been received from the abovementioned Administration that all effects of members of the A.I.F. are being correctly dealt with, and recent enquiries have proved fruitless on account of the reorganization of units, movements of troops and inaccessibility of records during this period of demobilisation and repatriation, it would be useless to institute enquiries abroad regarding the missing stick. However, in the event of same coming to hand later it will be promptly transmitted to you.



Will you please advise me as to the address of those in charge of the Anraing Communal Cemetery. I wish to write to them concerning my son's grave. I also wish to state that I found written in my ^{late} son's Diary the words - London Bank of Australia (41 Old Bailey St - Pass Book No 12224.)
(Australian Pass Book - No 23390.)

This was in the very end of the Diary - quite apart from his notes, that ended on the 2nd of November - so I wrote to 41, Old B. Street, & asked if my son had left any of his effects with them - or was in communication with them at the time of his death. I received an answer from the Manager yesterday (saying) upon enquiry, they found that he was buried at Anraing Communal Cemetery - situated eight & 1/2 miles N.E. of Tournai, Belgium. & particulars as to effects etcⁿ could be obtained from the Officer in charge of Base Records - Melbourne. I would be glad to hear of anything concerning him, I feel sure he left many of his effects, such as Bond Instrument, silver, cigarette case etc. things he prized most, in charge of some one. With reference to your letter of October 1st, I have to advise that your late son Lieut. A. J. PALLISER, Australian Flying Corps is now buried in Grave 1 Anvaing Churchyard. Anvaing is about 9 miles North East of Tournai, Belgium.

Lieut. Palliser's remains were exhumed during December 1919 from a small German Cemetery a few hundred yards East of their present resting place, the means of identification being a cross on which his regimental particulars were inscribed and letters which were found on his body.

Owing, no doubt, to the unsanitary condition in which the papers were found they were not forwarded to the Base for transmission to you.

The exhumation report does not say that any effects other than the papers mentioned were found on your late son's remains at the time his body was removed from the German Cemetery to Anvaing Churchyard.

I regret very much indeed that I am unable to offer you any more comforting information but owing to the time which has elapsed since the exhumation took place it is very difficult to trace any of the records pertaining to that period.
